- Mail Mail payment and coupon to a preassigned post office box.
- BB&T Financial Center Make a payment with a BB&T payment coupon at any of our financial centers in 15 states. Payments are processed the next business day.
- Association Pay (ACH) Have payments automatically deducted directly from a bank account at a U.S. financial institution. BB&T Association Services handles the enrollment, cancel and changes! Homeowners can enroll by mail or online at BBT.com/Payments. Payments are debited on the third of the month.*
- Online Bill Pay Homeowners can send their payment from any U.S. financial institution using an online bill-pay provider.
- eCheck Homeowners can go online at BBT.com/Payments and make a one-time electronic funds transfer by ACH debit from a checking or savings account at any U.S. financial institution. Payments may take up to four business days to process.
- Credit Card or Debit Card Homeowners can go online at BBT.com/Payments to pay by Visa®, MasterCard®, American Express® or Discover®. Payments are processed the next business day. A convenience fee of 2.95% of the transaction amount is charged for payments made online by credit card. A flat \$4.95 convenience fee is charged per transaction for payments made online by debit card.

A convenience fee of 2.95% of the transaction amount is charged for payments made by credit card, \$4.95 per transaction for payments made by debit card. The maximum payment amount is \$10,000 for a single credit/debit card payment transaction and \$20,000 for a single eCheck payment transaction. Multiple separate online payments can be submitted toward the same obligation; however, each separate payment transaction will incur a convenience fee, if applicable.
